The Office of the President- Bobby Wolgan

The office will not yet be open for walk ins, due to new Delta Covid-19 variant blowing up in Florida. Anyone can call with questions or make an appointment to meet with office staff. If you need immediate assistance, you may contact any Bonfire Board Member. Thank you for keeping all of us safe.

- An aggressive alligator had to be captured and killed in Lake Tammi. It is suspected that someone was feeding it, and it no longer feared humans. Please do not feed the wildlife in our park, as the result is usually not good for the animal or your neighbors.
- A Drainage Plan for the area behind 605 Tammi Dr. has been developed and scheduled for this winter. We are hopeful that this will greatly reduce the flooding during our rainy summer season for the 3 homes affected.
- Lake County approved one of our additional lots we want to make available for development. Two more lots are in the works at this time.
- Our sewer lift stations are being damaged and inoperable by residents flushing "flushable" wipes down their toilets. These do not work in our systems. We have spent 5k already this year on repairs. I'm standing over the Tammi Dr. pump station now with a Repair Tech waiting for an Engineer to arrive (on a Saturday pay). Please help get the word out.
- No Board Meeting is scheduled for October; however, the Finance Team has a Budget Meeting scheduled for Thursday Oct. 21, at 10am that is open to all interested Shareholders. The meeting is in the Clubhouse and face masks will be required. An early November Board Meeting will be scheduled to finalize that budget for 2022.
- Returning homeowners and renters need to fill out the "Resident Arrival/Check In Form" and submit to the office when they are back in Bonfire. Forms are in the Clubhouse and can be placed in the black box outside of the office when completed. You may also print off the form by going to the Bonfire Website/Residents Only/Forms.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

As we welcome you back, our seasonal residents, you will see some changes in the area since you left.

- As you turn onto Radio Road from 44 going towards 441, you will see two new developments. On the right is a development named Liberty Preserve. At completion, it will have 35 homes. Houses are now under construction. Further down Radio Road on the left, across from Gateway Church, is the new Silver Basin subdivision. At completion, it will contain 60 new homes. The much talked about Silver Lake club Subdivision, which will have 233 homes, has not yet started. It will be just off Radio Road and Morningside.
- Some restaurants have closed. Palm Gardens has new owners so it is closed for now as the new owners remodel. Cedar River Seafood has also closed.
- Our nearby Publix has completed their remodel and is open.
- The mall is still open, but the only large store is Belk. The theatre and entertainment area is open.

Health Committee Report

The purpose of the Bonfire Health & Safety Committee is to provide education and information to ensure the health and safety of all the residents of our community. The Bonfire Health & Safety Committee members for 2021 are Faye Hensley, Margaret Willis, Mary Louise Wade, Diane Weinbaum, and Nelson Craig.

WHAT IS ALS?

ALS, or amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord.

The disease was identified in 1869 by the French neurologist, Jean-Martin Charcot, but became more widely known internationally on June 2, 1941 when it ended the career of one of baseball's most beloved players, Lou Gehrig. For many years following, ALS was commonly known as Lou Gehrig's disease.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with the disease, and someone passes away from it.

Most people who develop ALS are between the ages of 40 and 70, with an average age of 55 at the time of diagnosis. However, cases of the disease do occur in people in their twenties and thirties.

Once ALS starts, it almost always progresses, eventually taking away the ability to walk, dress, write, speak, swallow, and breathe, and shortening the life span. The onset of ALS often involves muscle weakness or stiffness as early symptoms. Progression of weakness, wasting, and paralysis of the muscles of the limbs and trunk, as well as those that control vital functions such as speech, swallowing, and breathing, generally follows. ALS is typically a disease that involves a gradual onset. The initial symptoms and the progression rate of ALS can be quite varied in different people. One person may have trouble grasping a pen or lifting a coffee cup, while another person may experience a change in vocal pitch when speaking.

There is no cure for ALS yet. However, the ALS Association has made great research progress in the last few years, such as:

- 5 genes discovered in the past 2 years
- Over 150 active research projects
- 9 global research collaborations
- New drug Radicava approved by FDA
- Several drugs in clinical trials

The ALS association mission is to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest.

Fundraisers such as the Ice Bucket Challenge of 2014 raised \$115 million resulting in a massive increase in the ALS Association's capacity to invest in promising research, the development of assistive technologies, and increased access to care and services for people with ALS.
