



Best Bedtime for Your Heart

A recent article in <u>Consumer Reports</u> addressed why going to bed earlier can be good for your health. In a study of 88,028 adults over 5.7 years researchers found that: "Going to bed between 11:00 PM and 11:59 PM was linked to a 42% higher risk of heart

disease, heart attack, heart failure or stroke compared with a bedtime between 10:00 PM and 10:59 PM. Going to bed after midnight most nights was associated with a 25% higher heart risk than heading off to sleep between 10:00 PM and 10:59 PM." Researchers pointed out that late bedtimes are linked to heart related problems, such as higher blood pressure, clogged arteries, obesity and high blood sugar.

Health Supplements Bogus Claims

A recent article in the <u>Harvard Health Letter</u> warned consumers about manufacturers of health supplements bogus claims.

The FDA called out 7 supplement companies for "illegally claiming their products could treat or prevent cardiovascular disease, such as, atherosclerosis or heart failure." Warning letters were issued to Essential Scale Media Inc.; Calroy Health Sciences; IWI; BergerMet North America; Healthy Trends World-World Wide (Golden After 50); Chambers' Apothecary; and Anabolic Laboratories. Since the FDA does not evaluate supplements for safety or effectiveness or how and where they are manufactured, you can't be sure what is in them. Since they can interact with your medicine, it is important to talk to your doctor before taking any supplements according to the FDA.

Summary of the Health and Safety Presentation in the Clubhouse by Detective James Getford on March 14, 2023

We were pleased to see the great turnout for Lake County Sherriff's Detective James Getford's presentation on park security and what we can do as residents to help keep our park safer from would be thieves.

The main topic was the installation of home security cameras and the best placement of those cameras to protect not only ours but also our neighbor's home. He also recommended the installation of motion activated security lights not only at the front of but also the back or side of your house. Detective Getford brought an example of a typical security camera and brochures which he left for those interested.

He also talked on the importance of locking up and installing hidden kill switches on golf carts and securing other attractive articles like lawn mowers, bicycles, etc.

Detective Getford also mentioned not confronting a suspected thief or thieves but to get as much information as possible on the person and type of vehicle, if applicable, that they were driving.

As it is getting close to the Snowbirds returning north, there will be no further presentations this season.
