#### MAIL DELIVERY:

As most of you are aware, there are problems with mail delivery. We are receiving returned mail from the USPS stating no forwarding address or it has expired. For example, we received a returned mail that went out in April and the office didn't receive it back until November 10<sup>th</sup>. We have contacted USPS customer service regarding the length of time it took to return it to us and are waiting for a response.

Florida Statute #719 states one permanent address be maintained in our file system. Accordingly, unless you complete and sign a form stating your permanent address is other than Bonfire, all mail will be sent to your Bonfire address.

It is your responsibility to file a forwarding address with the USPS when you are not at Bonfire. Directions for forwarding your mail can be found on the USPS internet site or you can pick up a copy in the office. If you have questions, please contact the USPS.

The current Departure Form has a place for your address other than Bonfire; however, that is for us to notify you should there be an emergency with your home. We cannot change your mailing address without the appropriate form signed as it is a violation of Federal law for us to do so. We have prepared a new Departure Form that states for **Emergency Use Only**.

Additionally, the Directory Form you completed has space for another address you want printed in the directory. It is **NOT** for forwarding your mail.

We hope that this helps with delivery of your mail going forward. All forms are on our website under Residents Only tab, forms.

The purpose of the Bonfire Health & Safety Committee is to provide education and information to ensure the health and safety of all the residents of our community. The Bonfire Health & Safety Committee members for 2021 are Faye Hensley, Margaret Willis, Mary Louise Wade, Diane Weinbaum, and Nelson Craig.

# TWELVE WAYS TO HAVE A HEALTHY HOLIDAY SEASON

- 1. Wash hands often to help prevent the spread of germs. It's flu season. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. **Bundle up to stay dry and warm.** Wear appropriate outdoor clothing: light, warm layers, gloves, hats, scarves, and waterproof boots.
- 3. **Manage stress.** Give yourself a break if you feel stressed out, overwhelmed, and out of control. Some of the best ways to manage stress are to find support, connect socially, and get plenty of sleep.
- 4. **Don't drink and drive or let others drink and drive.** Whenever anyone drives drunk, they put everyone on the road in danger. Choose not to drink and drive and help others do the same.
- 5. **Be smoke-free.** Avoid smoking and secondhand smoke. Smokers have greater health risks because of their tobacco use, but nonsmokers also are at risk when exposed to tobacco smoke.
- 6. **Fasten seat belts while driving or riding in a motor vehicle.** Buckle up every time, no matter how short the trip and encourage passengers to do the same.
- 7. **Get exams and screenings.** Ask your health care provider what exams you need and when to get them. Update your personal and family history.
- 8. **Get your vaccinations.** Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine each year.
- 9. **Monitor children.** Keep potentially dangerous toys, food, drinks, household items, and other objects out of children's reach. Protect them from drowning, burns, falls, and other potential accidents.
- 10. **Practice fire safety.** Most residential fires occur during the winter months, so don't leave fireplaces, space heaters, food cooking on stoves, or candles unattended. Have an emergency plan and practice it regularly.
- 11. **Prepare food safely.** Remember these simple steps: Wash hands and surfaces often, avoid cross-contamination, cook foods to proper temperatures and refrigerate foods promptly.
- 12. **Eat healthy, stay active.** Eat fruits and vegetables which pack nutrients and help lower the risk for certain diseases. Limit your portion sizes and foods high in fat, salt, and sugar. Also, be active for at least 2½ hours a week.
