- CPR/AED Workshop, Feb 13 — two sessions to be held in the library: 10:00 AM - Noon and 6:00 - 8:00 PM. Please sign up in the clubhouse on the Health Committee Bulletin Board – Leader: Nelson Craig. This is a 2 hour workshop.
- The Committee has safety concerns about Rules not being followed, especially children driving golf carts, misbehaving in the pool area, an aggressive dog in the park and lack of pet poop scoop. What is a person to do if they see a rule being broken?
- Check your Vial of Life to see if your information page is up to date. If you don't have a Vial of Life or need a new paper form, ask a Health Committee member.
- Sharps Disposal – needles and other sharps may be disposed of with your household trash if you use a heavy plastic container, such as those from coffee or laundry detergent with a tight - fitting lid. The lid should also be taped closed.

Health & Safety Committee Educational Series for Tidbits

FEBRUARY IS HEART HEALTH MONTH

- Heart Disease causes approximately 1 of every 4 deaths in the United States
- About 50% of sudden cardiac deaths occur outside a hospital. This suggests that many people don't act on early warning signs.
- Survey results show that only 27% of the respondents were aware of all major symptoms and knew to call 9-1-1.
- The "Early Signs" of a heart attack occur in over 50% of patients. If recognized in time these "beginnings" can be treated before the heart is damaged !

Did you Know?

85% of HEART DAMAGE OCCURS WITHIN THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF A HEART ATTACK. Know the subtle danger signs of a heart attack and act upon them immediately BEFORE HEART DAMAGE OCCURS

You may or may not experience any or all of these symptoms. People may experience mild chest symptoms, such as pressure, burning, aching or tightness. These symptoms may come and go until finally becoming constant and severe.

SO WHAT ARE THE EARLY SYMPTOMS ?

1. Anxiety
2. Fatigue
3. Nausea
4. Back Pain
5. Jaw pain
6. Feeling of fullness
7. Shortness of Breath
8. Chest pressure, squeezing or discomfort
9. Pain that travels down one or both arms

- Women's cardiovascular health has not been studied as much as men's.
