Bonfire Utilities Team Report

The Utilities Team has had a very busy 2018. During the spring, the team investigated concerns and planned projects. The following were the major projects and activities.

Water Line Improvement Program

In July, 320 foot of new line were installed to improve the durability of our water delivery system. Now when a problem occurs, it can be rapidly isolated and repaired, without affecting other portions of Bonfire. The number of Red Flag shutdowns decreases. This program will continue into 2019 with a less aggressive but, equally beneficial plan.

The Waste Water Treatment Facility Has Two Plants

Plant #2 has two blowers operating on a duplex system. This summer the one blower failed and was replaced. As designed, the other blower was able to cover the entire load, without interruption. Plant #2 does not have the capacity to support Bonfire, by itself, during the winter months. Plant #1 had only one blower. A second blower was installed in November and is now in operation.

Waste Water Treatment Facility – Spray Field Pumps

The #2 Spray Field Pump failed in mid-December. It was replaced after Christmas.

The #1 Pump has the capacity and carried the entire load, during this downtime.

<u>Hurricane Preparedness – for the Utilities</u>

The Team developed, reviewed and updated the Pre-and Post-Hurricane Procedures for the Utilities. For after Hurricane recovery, we now have all of our Waste Water System either hooked up to, or prewired for fast hook-up, to a generator.

Repairs - Waste Water Lines and Lift Stations & Water Lines and Valves

Two Lift Stations were dismantled and unplugged (foreign debris). Several manholes were cleaned (some from foreign debris). Several sewer lines were unplugged, usually roots.

Several water line breaks were repaired; usual causes, roots or heavy equipment. Several water valves were replaced, some leaks and some broken (improper wrench).

We are now in the middle of flu season. A flu vaccine is the best way to protect yourself and your loved ones from the dangers of the influenza and its severe complications. If you haven't had a vaccine, it's not too late. Click on the link below to locate a clinic where you can get one.

In addition to getting vaccinated, there are several precautions you can take to prevent the spread of influenza and other respiratory diseases. These precautions are particularly important because here in Bonfire, we gather frequently in groups for meetings, games, cards, and celebrations. To avoid the spread of germs:

Avoid close contact with people who are sick, particularly hand-shaking and when they are coughing.

Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand cleaner.

Clean and disinfect surfaces that you touch frequently.

Stay home when you are sick, particularly if you have a fever.

Cover your mouth and nose when sneezing and coughing. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.

Park visitors get a spectacular viewing experience from the boardwalks and overlooks along the spring run. There is also the historic Thursby House which was built in 1872 and became a hub of activity on the St. Johns River, hosting steamboat passengers as they made their way up and down the river. 


