As the Clubhouse reopens on July 1 and social activities resume, we would like to ask everyone to remember that some of our members are still vulnerable. Masks are not required, but encouraged--- especially, if anyone in your group has not been vaccinated. In addition, as always, please remember to frequently wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer. This especially is necessary when playing cards or other activities where items are passed around. When using the Clubhouse, please clean all surfaces after each use. This means tables, countertops, etc. Supplies, such as Clorox Wipes, will be available in the kitchen area. The chairs have been professionally cleaned and we would ask all to take care to keep them in good condition.

Initially, activities expected to resume indoors are those involving small groups. Bingo, karaoke, dances, and potlucks will resume later in the year, when more residents are here, as is usual. The Social Club board and the chairmen of respective events will determine when specific events will resume.

Lake County has 27 Fire Stations. They handled 23,717 calls in 2020.

The fire station that responds to Bonfire is Station 71. It is currently located at 11305 Park Av, which is east of CR473, south of our park. It is 2.6 miles away from Bonfire.

Next year (2022), groundbreaking will happen for a new Station 71. It will be right on CR473, on the west side, near the intersection of Bell Rd.

Health Committee Report

The purpose of the Bonfire Health & Safety Committee is to provide education and information to ensure the health and safety of all the residents of our community. The Bonfire Health & Safety Committee members for 2021 are Faye Hensley, Margaret Willis, Mary Louise Wade, Diane Weinbaum, and Nelson Craig.

SMART 911

Over 80% of calls made to 9-1-1 come from mobile phones. When you dial 9-1-1 from a mobile phone, the 9-1-1 call takers have very little information to help you – only your phone number and a very general sense of your location. This is a serious problem in an emergency when seconds count, particularly if you or your loved ones have medical conditions, or are unable to safely speak.

During an emergency, having the appropriate personnel, equipment and information is imperative to the responding agency's ability to properly manage the situation. With this in mind, Lake County has joined the national Smart911 network in an effort to improve its emergency response through the use of vital information provided by residents.

Smart911 allows residents to create free Safety Profiles made up of critical household data that could be pivotal to first-responders during an emergency. The profiles can consist of anything from phone numbers, medical conditions, and disabilities, to photos of family members and floor plans. "The more information that a citizen can provide to us in an emergency, the better," said Greg Holcomb, Emergency 9-1-1 Coordinator for Lake County. "The time during an emergency is often very chaotic, and details in addition to the vital questions can be advantageous when made available to the 9-1-1 Telecommunicators. Smart911 allows citizens to proactively provide us with those details prior to an emergency."

With Smart911 being a national network, anytime a citizen dials 9-1-1 across the country and the call is answered by a local Smart911 supported center, their profile will be available. This could make the dispatcher privy to crucial, possibly life-saving information.
