# WATERING RESTRICTIONS (SJRWMD)

The St. Johns River Water Management District's watering restrictions are designed to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation. The restrictions allow enough water to maintain healthy landscapes year-round. The mandatory restrictions specify the time when watering may occur, the amount of water that may be applied, and the days when watering may occur for residential and nonresidential locations. These days depend on whether the address ends in an odd or even number, and on the time of year.

Time of year	Homes with odd numbered or no addresses	Homes with even numbered addresses	Nonresidential properties
time		Thursday/Sunday	Tuesday/Friday
Eastern Standard Time	Saturday	Sunday	Tuesday

- Daylight saving time: Second Sunday in March until the first Sunday in November
- Eastern Standard Time: First Sunday in November until the second Sunday in March
- An odd numbered address is one that ends in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9.
- An even-numbered address is one that ends in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8.
- Water only when needed and not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Water for no more than one hour per zone.
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water and water from public and private utilities.
- Some exceptions apply.

#### **HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE NEWS**

On February 12, 2020, nearly 30 residents attended a presentation entitled "Senior Safety" given by Lake County Sheriff's Office Master Deputy Walter Wolfe and Deputy Bill Chrisman. They briefly described many of the services offered by the Sheriff's Office, many of particular interest to senior citizens. These included:

- > Tours of the County Jail. This 2-3 hour tour requires a minimum of 12-15 participants for a bus. You can see how the Lake County Jail is using inmates to save the taxpayer money as well as prepare inmates for employment after release. Some examples are a 12 acre garden, which provides food for the jail and to the local food bank. Inmates also work on grounds details, at the animal shelter, sewing uniforms, and in maintenance. In addition, this year, inmates will be used to help build ten Habitat for Humanity homes.
- Sheriff's Citizens Academy. Providing an opportunity for citizens to become familiar with the operations of the Sheriff's Office, this 12 week class includes tours of the courthouse and the CSI operations. In addition, ride-along with law enforcement for up to 12 hour shifts are scheduled. If you plan on doing this, you will need to have a background check, wear a bulletproof vest, and sign a waiver. The Academy classes can be held on our site with buses taking participants on the tours.
- ➤ Vial of Life. These vials can save your life. Ask any Health Committee member how to use them.
- Safety Net Program. If you know someone who might become lost if they leave their home, the Sheriff's Department has a program to help. A bracelet with Lo-Jac capability can be worn by the person, allowing them to be found quickly. At no cost to you, the program has 100% success rate of finding lost persons within an hour of reporting.
- Neighborhood/Crime Watch. Look out for your neighbors!! Most home burglaries take place during the day, when residents are out and about. Most car burglaries take place at night.

Snowbirds: have a neighbor act as caretaker of your home. Take pictures of everything in your home, and leave with your neighbor. Give them Power of Attorney to act on your behalf if your home is burglarized. This will save time for law enforcement to proceed with their investigation and prosecution. What can you do to protect yourself?

- Record the serial numbers/VINs of everything of value. Pawn shops in Florida have a duty to record serial numbers of any items sold to them. This aids greatly in recovering stolen goods.
- Install motion detector lights and/or alarms. Lock your home and your car whenever you are not in them.
- Golf cart security: install a hidden switch to cut off the battery. Change the key set to a unique key. Tire locks are also available.

There is so much more information these gentlemen could provide, we ran out of time. We intend to bring them back another time to discuss Active Shooters, Identity Theft, and other topics.
