Did You Know.....History of Bonfire Mobile Home Village

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Last month, this article discussed the naming of the Haynes Creek area after Captain Melton Haynes.

An interesting side note is the spelling of the name—is it Haynes or is it Haines?

The spelling of "Haines" has appeared on U.S. Geological Survey topographic maps since 1965, but all evidence suggests the stream was named for Captain Melton Haynes, widely regarding as one of Lake County's most prominent early citizens.

In 2005, a proposal was submitted by the President of the Lake County Historical Society to change officially the spelling of the name Haines Creek to Haynes Creek. The proposal included resolutions and proclamations from the Lake County Water Authority, The Lake Board of County Commissioners, the towns of Tavares, Leesburg, Eustis, and Mt. Dora. In addition, it also included personal letters of endorsements from respected state and local elected officials, historians, the Haynes family and historical and heritage societies. Public support was overwhelming.

This case was heard by the U.S. Board on Geographic Names. On September 8, 2005 the Board rendered its decision to make the change in agreement with the recommendations of all interested parties. Effective that date the name was changed.

Melanoma, the Most Serious Skin Cancer

May has been designated National Melanoma Skin Cancer Prevention Month by the American Academy of Dermatology.

There are four types of skin cancer:

- 1. Basal cell carcinoma
- 2. Squamous cell carcinoma
- 3. Melanoma
- 4. Nonmelanoma skin cancer

Melanoma is often called the most serious skin cancer because it tends to spread.

Melanoma occurs in cells known as melanocytes, skin cells found in the upper layer of skin. Melanoma occurs when DNA damage from burning or tanning due to UV radiation triggers changes (mutations) in the melanocytes, resulting in uncontrolled cellular growth.

Melanoma is usually curable when detected and treated early. Once melanoma has spread deeper into the skin or other parts of the body, it becomes more difficult to treat and can be deadly. In most cases, the surgeon will cut cancerous tissue from the body by removing malignant moles, the skin surrounding the malignant mole and removing nearby lymph nodes if the cancer has spread. Melanoma does not respond well to chemotherapy and the effects of drug treatments are quite limited.

Melanoma signs include:

- 1. A large brownish spot with darker speckles
- 2. A mole that changes in color, size or feel or that bleeds
- 3. A small lesion with an irregular border and portions that appear red, pink, white, blue or blue-black
- 4. A painful lesion that itches or burns
- 5. Dark lesions on your palms, soles, fingertips or toes, or on mucous membranes lining your mouth, nose, vagina or anus

As is true with many cancers, early detection and treatment is key. A regular skin check with a dermatologist is critical as well as self-awareness of any changes in your skin.
