Fellow Shareholders:

Please be advised that the Bonfire Board of Directors is asking all shareholders with palm trees on their property to agree to a \$50.00 charge per tree for trimming.

We have contracted with G&J Tree Trimmers to do the work. They are qualified and have done a lot of work at Bonfire.

The palm trees throughout Bonfire are badly in need of trimming. The cost of \$50.00 per tree is a group price and to wait and find your own tree company will cost more money. This is an opportunity to help keep Bonfire looking its best at a very reasonable cost.

We will be notifying you of the number of palm trees in your yard and asking your permission to trim them. Our target date is September 18th to have everyone contacted and fees collected.

Along the line of park beautification, some of you have been contacted about overgrown weeds around your unit. It takes time, energy and sometimes money to notify you about this responsibility that is yours. Please make sure you have someone lined up to take "total" care of your yard.

By now, most of you know that Larry Dennis has resigned his position as boat slip overseer. As a result, I am imposing a moratorium on any boat slip activity, new assignments, upgrades, etc. This will be in effect until the Board of Directors determines the best way to move forward in this matter. I am saddened by how this all came about. Larry has spent 9+ years managing the boat slips and has done a very good job for 9+ years.

In the last year, emotions, tempers, and attitudes have prevailed instead of common respect, civility, and cooperation.

It is my observation as your president for approximately 18 months plus 4-1/2 years serving as a director: everyone in Bonfire gets a lot for the nickel you are "not" paying.

### **Health & Safety Committee Report**

NOTE: Hi again from your health and safety committee: Nelson Craig (chair), Susie Lorch and Judy Holmgren. We are still looking for people interested in joining our team. We are also working on having guest speakers for about 1 hr. talks and informal lunch talks after the Friday lunches--short topics about 30 minutes in length.

The purpose of the Bonfire Health & Safety Committee is to provide education and information to ensure the health and safety of all the residents of our community.

Vials of Life are now available in the Clubhouse by the AED. Forms that are asking for resident interests for health talks and/or Tidbits articles are also available. Once completed, just place it in the bottom slot of the Social Club form rack by the main entrance. Thanks from your Health and Safety Team!

Flu season will be here before you know it. We have scheduled two flu clinics this year offering "regular" flu shots, "flu quad 65+", and Covid options. The first is scheduled for September 15 and another on December 1 (after our snowbirds return). Both clinics will be 10 AM to 12 PM. It will be necessary to sign up and complete an



insurance questionnaire prior. A sign-up sheet and questionnaires will be available in the clubhouse. We encourage you to sign up as soon as possible as these slots will fill up quickly. Check your insurance to determine if these shots are covered. You'll need to bring your questionnaire and insurance card (and Social Security card if you are on Medicare) with you on your scheduled day. If you do not have insurance coverage for these shots, please bring your questionnaire and cash payment (costs will be published as soon as we receive them). Records of your shots will be added to the flshots.gov site, accessible by your doctor/caregiver.

## How Does Sleep Affect Your Heart Health?

Sleep is not a luxury. It is critical to good health. Sleep helps your body repair itself. Getting enough good sleep also helps you function normally during the day.

Adults who sleep less than 7 hours each night are more likely to say they have had health problems, including heart attack, asthma and depression. Some of these health problems raise the risk for heart disease, heart attack and stroke. These health problems include high blood pressure, Type 2 diabetes and obesity.

What can you do to get better sleep?

- Stick to a regular sleep schedule.
- Get enough natural light; try going for a morning or lunchtime walk.
- Get enough physical activity during the day, but not within a few hours of bedtime.
- Avoid artificial light within a few hours of bedtime, especially from your computer or phone.
- Don't eat or drink within a few hours of bedtime; especially avoid alcohol and foods high in fat or sugar.
- · Keep your bedroom cool, dark and quiet.
- Work with your health care team to identify obstacles to good sleep, including other medical conditions.

Let me thank all of the residents of Bonfire for their contributions to our food bank program. Many thanks to Rick and Donna Kelley for their many years of support in taking our donations to Lake Cares. Since their move out of Bonfire, I've been delivering our donations.

I've been talking with the volunteers at Lake Cares and while they are very appreciative of our efforts, they ask that we limit our donations to food items only. There have been occasions of items such as candles, light bulbs, air conditioning filters and some clothing items being left in the donation tub (in the clubhouse). They appreciate the thoughtfulness but have no way to distribute these items. So let's help them out and leave only food items in the tub.

It is acceptable if the box is open, (for example, a box of individual bags of popcorn), IF the individual bags are unopened. Food past its expiration date cannot be used.
